FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

MARCHESHVAN

Cheshvan is the second month of the Hebrew year (or the eighth month when counting from Nissan). Like all Hebrew months, the name Cheshvan is of Babylonian origin, corresponding to the constellation of the Scorpion (Scorpio), visible in the night sky during this lunar month. Cheshvan usually overlaps the solar months of October and November.

The month is also called Mar Cheshvan meaning "Bitter Cheshvan" because it has no holidays to make it joyous until the Messiah comes. Some say Mar Cheshvan should actually be read "Marach shevan," the "month of light."

The original Hebrew name of the month is Bul, meaning "withering," referring to the withering of tree branches and field stubble during this month. As the Hebrew Bible says:

"And in the eleventh year, in the month of Bul—that is, the eighth month—the House was completed according to all its details and all its specifications. It took him seven years to build it." (I Kings, 6:38)

Marcheshvan in Jewish history and tradition

- **8 Marcheshvan** (66 CE) Jewish nationalists defeat the Romans at the famous Beth Horon Pass, killing 5,300 footmen and 380 horsemen.
- 11 Marcheshvan (circa 2105 BCE) Methuselah dies at age 969
- 11 Marcheshvan (circa 1553 BCE) Death of Rachel while giving birth to Benjamin
- 12 Marcheshvan (1995) Assassination of Yitzhak Rabin; now a national memorial day
- **15 Marcheshvan** King Jeroboam's alternative feast of Sukkot for the people of the Northern Kingdom (1 Kings 12:32–33)
- **15 Marcheshvan** (165 BCE) Death of Matityahu (Mattathias), who began the Maccabean revolt in the city of Modiin
- **16 Marcheshvan** (1938) Kristallnacht/Pogromnacht: 1,400 synagogues and numerous copies of the Tanakh are purposefully and systematically set on fire and allowed to burn in Nazi Germany
- **16 Marcheshvan** (1994) Death of Reb Shlomo Carlebach
- **17 Marcheshvan** (circa 960 BCE) First Temple completed by King Solomon (it was not inaugurated until the following Tishrei however..
- **23 Marcheshvan** (137 BCE) Hasmonean holiday commemorating the removal from the Holy Temple of altar stones which were defiled by the Greeks

KISLEV

Kislev (or Chislev) is the ninth month on the Jewish calendar, counting from Nisan. It is best known for the holiday of Chanukah, which begins on 25 Kislev. The message of Chanukah is the eternal power of light over darkness—good over evil. Aside from commemorating the miraculous victory of the small Jewish army over the mighty Syrian-Greek empire, Chanukah celebrates the miracle of the oil. When the Jews sought to light the Temple menorah after the war, they found only one small jug of pure oil. Miraculously, the one-day supply burned for eight days, and the sages instituted the eight-day festival of Chanukah during which we kindle the menorah nightly.

Holidays in Kisley

25 Kisley – 2 Tevet – Hanukkah – ends 3 Tevet if Kisley is short

Kislev in Jewish history and tradition

- **6 Kislev** (1973) Death of David Ben-Gurion
- **8 Kislev** (1978) Death of Golda Meir.
- 14 Kisley (c. 1445 BCE) Death of Reuben, son of Jacob.
- 14 Kisley (c. 1568 BCE) Birth of Reuben, son of Jacob.
- 15 Kisley (167 BCE) The Greeks set up the "Abomination of Desolation" in the Temple.
- **17 Kislev** (1947) The United Nations General Assembly approves a plan for the partition of Palestine, which eventually led to the creation of the State of Israel.
- **20 Kislev** (c. 457 BCE) Ezra addresses a three-day assemblage of Jews in Jerusalem, telling them to adhere to the Torah and to dissolve their interfaith marriages.
- 21 Kislev (c. 128 BCE) The Samaritan temple at Mount Gerizim was destroyed by John Hyrcanus I.
- 25 Kislev (164 BCE) The Hanukkah miracle
- 25 Kislev (167 BCE) The Greeks make pagan sacrifices in the Temple
- 27 Kisley (c. 2105 BCE) Flood rains cease (According to Genesis 6–8).
