# FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

## **MARCHESHVAN**

We will soon be in the month of MarCheshvan followed by Kislev. After the hectic activity, fasting and praying during the months of Elul and Tishrei, we have a short break to gather our breath. A quiet month. However in Jewish history a lot happened during this month

In this month King Solomon completed the construction of the first Temple – though the dedication did not take place until a year later, in the Hebrew month of Tishrei.

#### Two Key Events

If we search further, we find two other events that occurred in the month of Cheshvan. The first was the flood in the times of Noah. The flood began on the 17th of Cheshvan, and the waters receded by the following year on the 27th of Cheshvan, allowing Noah and the other inhabitants of the ark to disembark. It is significant to note that the flood was originally intended to begin on the 11th of Cheshvan. However, Methuselah passed away, and thus the flood was delayed in deference to the seven-day period of mourning that followed his death.

The second important event that occurred in Cheshvan seems unrelated at first glance. This was the death of Jacob's wife Rachel, as well as the birth of Benjamin, which occurred on the 11th of Cheshvan. It was precisely the same day as Methusaleh's death, the very day that flood had originally been slated to begin. As there are no coincidences in the Torah, we must ask: What is the connection between these two events, and what do they reveal about the essence of the month of Cheshvan?

In thinking about what the matriarch Rachel and her son Benjamin stand for, respectively, we can see that Rachel represents the Jewish people in exile, and Benjamin represents the completed state of the Jewish people in the Land of Israel. Rachel spent her entire life outside of Israel, and passed away just as Jacob and his family entered the holy land. As our Sages tell us, her spirit accompanied the Jewish people as they went into Babylonian exile, and it is she who cries for her children in exile until the final redemption comes.

#### Marcheshvan in Jewish history and tradition

- 11 Marcheshvan (circa 2105 BCE) Methuselah dies at age 969
- 11 Marcheshvan (circa 1553 BCE) Death of Rachel while giving birth to Benjamin
- 12 Marcheshvan (1995) Assassination of Yitzhak Rabin; now a national memorial day
- **15 Marcheshvan** King Jeroboam's alternative feast of Sukkot for the people of the northern Kingdom (1 Kings 12:32–33)
- **15 Marcheshvan** (165 BCE) Death of Matityahu (Mattathias), who began the Maccabean revolt in the city of Modiin
- **16 Marcheshvan** (1938) Kristallnacht/Pogromnacht: 1,400 synagogues and numerous copies of the Tanakh are purposefully and systematically set on fire and allowed to burn in Nazi Germany
- **17 Marcheshvan** (circa 960 BCE) First Temple completed by King Solomon (it was not inaugurated until the following Tishrei however).
- **23 Marcheshvan** (137 BCE) Hasmonean holiday commemorating the removal from the Holy Temple of altar stones which were defiled by the Greeks

## **KISLEV**

Kislev is the ninth month of the year, counting from Nisan. In the Torah we find that the root of the word Kislev means 'trust' and 'hope'

In terms of the historical narrative of Hanukkah, the Hasmoneans had tremendous *bitahon* to stand up to their Roman oppressors. Despite the darkness of their time, they trusted in the miraculous. This inspired them to look at a defiled Temple and envision its re-purification. Because of this trust, their eyes were open enough to find a small measure of oil with which to kindle the Menorah.

#### Kislev in Jewish history and tradition

- **6 Kislev** (1973) Death of David Ben-Gurion.
- 14 Kislev (circa 1445 BC) Death of Reuben, son of Jacob.
- 14 Kislev (circa 1568 BC) Birth of Reuben, son of Jacob.
- **20 Kislev** (circa 457 BC) Ezra addresses a three-day assemblage of Jews in Jerusalem, telling them to adhere to the Torah and to dissolve their interfaith marriages.
- 25 Kislev (164 BC) The Hanukkah miracle
- 25 Kislev (167 BC) The Greeks make pagan sacrifices in the Temple
- 27 Kisley (circa 2105 BC) Flood rains cease (According to Genesis 6–8).

May you all have a wonderful peaceful month now and enjoy the celebration of Hanukkah a month later.


